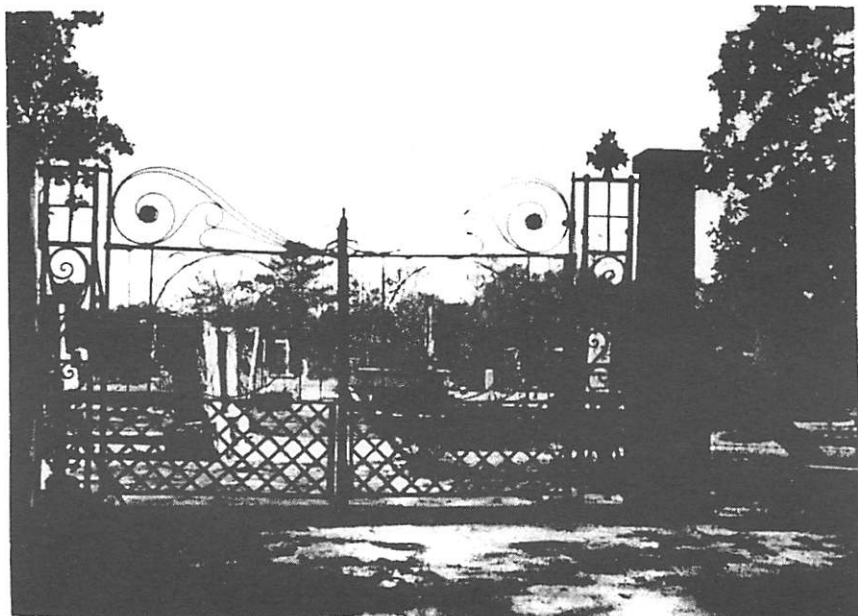

THE CEMETERY GATES

The Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery is located near the Church. The handsome iron gates originally located at the entrance to the Lewis J. Patterson home were a gift from Mr. and Mrs. W.K. Thompson. The two gate post were a gift from Mr. William C. Brown.

The gates were erected at the entrance to the cemetery in 1915 when the old wooden fence was replaced by a heavy wire fence.

In 1944 the Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery Association was organized and a perpetual fund for upkeep of the cemetery was established.

In 1990 a cast iron picket fence was erected and at that time the beautiful gates were repaired and painted.



Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery A Brief Description and History

Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery is located just off of South Carolina Highway 97 in the heart of the Liberty Hill community, northwest Kershaw County. The cemetery and the Liberty Hill Presbyterian Church are situated at the end of a picturesque lane running east off of SC 97 opposite Peay's Ferry Road. Reaching the church from SC 97, the cemetery is seen on the right. It slopes gracefully down to the edge of lovely woods of oak, hickory, gum, pine and cedar trees.

Although the cemetery and the church are separate entities, the cemetery shares its origins with the formation of the church. The church was officially declared and enrolled as a member of Harmony Presbytery in October of 1851; however, for about 30 years prior, a Liberty Hill congregation worshipped as a chapel of Beaver Creek Presbyterian Church. The congregation met at Liberty Hill but was served by the minister and session of the mother church at Beaver Creek. It was during this period that Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery was begun. The close ties between the church and the cemetery are evidenced by the fact that all adult members of the church are automatically made members of the cemetery association.¹

We cannot be sure who was the first buried in Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery or exactly when that first burial may have occurred. However, we know that the cemetery was well established by 1850. The earliest death recorded on a marker in the cemetery is that of Zadock Perry who died on January 15, 1815. But his marker and the one for his son, Zadock Elmore Perry, who died in 1829, were moved to the Liberty Hill cemetery from the Perry family cemetery on the north side of Hess Branch. This is explained by a brass plaque on the back of Zadock Perry's stone marker in Square #5. The marker recording the next earliest death is that of Robert Brown who died in 1832. He is buried in Square #14 with his brother, Joseph Brown, who died in 1833. The burial of Robert Brown was probably the first in this cemetery although we cannot be certain. Several other markers indicate burials prior to 1850: Frances W. Dixon who died in 1842, Jane C. Dixon who died in 1845, John B. Dixon who died in 1846, Frances Barnes and Calvin Stover who died in 1849. In addition, cemetery records indicate that there are three very early graves in Square #7 known as the "lost graves". We do not know when these burials were made but it is likely that they were among the earliest. In her book, *Bradford Roots and Branches*, Nancy V. A. Jacob says that the first grave in Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery was that of Calvin Stover.² His marker in Square #22, Section A, indicates that he died in 1849 which would make his burial one of the earliest, but not the first. It is not known where Mrs. Jacob got her information but this particular bit seems to be in error. In any event, there is considerable evidence that the Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery was established before 1850.

According to Miss Louise Johnston's book, *History and Homes of Liberty Hill, South Carolina*³ the land for the original cemetery confines was donated by John Brown. The

cemetery was expanded to the south in 1953, and expanded to the east in 1991. The land for these expansions was graciously donated by the Westrope family, descendants and heirs of John Brown and Author Pomeroy Brown.

The cemetery has had handsome and distinctive fencing over the years. The original was wooden and some dear 'Ole Timers tell us that the more adventurous boys of an earlier time used to walk along its top in the manner of tightrope walkers. The granite posts were gifts from William C. Brown. There was a major fencing upgrade project in 1915 when the wood was replaced with wire fencing. It was also at this time that the cemetery gained one of its most distinctive features, the lovely old wrought iron gates at the main entrance. These gates had first been used at the grand old Lewis Patterson home site and were a gift of heirs, Mr. & Mrs. William K. Thompson, Sr. In later years, descendants attached a bronze plaque to the gates that reads, "Colonel L. J. Patterson's gates presented by Mr. and Mrs. W. K. Thompson".⁴ Eventually the wire fence gave way to age and another major upgrade was undertaken in 1990-1991. The lovely gates and granite posts were retained and complementary wrought iron pickets placed across the entire front of the cemetery facing the church. A substantial chain link fence with gates on the north and west encompasses the remainder. These handsome cemetery fences have been a source of pride for the community, and rightly so.

In 1944, at the suggestion of Dr. Samuel Hudson Hay, the elders of Liberty Hill Presbyterian Church called a special meeting of the congregation to consider the organization of a cemetery association.⁵ Trustees were appointed and a charter obtained from the Secretary of State, in the name of "The Liberty Hill Cemetery Association", dated July 31, 1944. The original board of trustees consisted of Mr. C. D. Cunningham⁶ (Chairman), Mr. E. L. Jones (Treasurer), Miss Lizzie (Elizabeth P.) Richards (Secretary), Mr. W. E. Cunningham, Dr. S. H. Hay, Miss Clara Johnston and Mr. L. P. Thompson. Mr. N. S. Richards was an early addition to the board. The association has always enjoyed the support of its members, but it has thrived over the years because of the hard work and dedication of an unusually talented and devoted group of trustees.⁷ By-laws were adopted early and amended through the years as needed. The latest version is at appendix II. In 1960, the charter was amended to change the name of the organization to "The Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery Association". Initially, membership was open to adult church members who were assessed one dollar as annual dues. Later, membership was opened as well to interested persons who might be members of other churches. Additional money was earned by contributions and sometimes by the sale of souvenir plates. An endowment fund was established and nurtured over the early years. In 1972 revised procedures for the management of the endowment were formalized and provisions made for the recognition of memorials. A plaque was erected at the main gate that announces memorials of \$500 or more, and other memorials are recorded in a book of remembrances.⁸

A most delightful practice of the cemetery association has been to hold periodic "homecoming" celebrations. These wonderful gatherings were begun early in the life of the association and have usually been held in conjunction with general membership meetings that are called every four years.⁹

As of this survey, the remains of two hundred seventy-six persons have been interred in the Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery. They were a diverse and wonderful group of people, many whose accomplishments are quite remarkable. Merely by reading the markers we see three who were ministers¹⁰ and five who were physicians.¹¹ We know of at least one other minister, Lt. Col. John E. Richards. Perhaps others were ministers or physicians as well but do not have it noted on their markers. There are markers for veterans of the American Revolution¹², The War Between The States¹³, The Spanish-American War¹⁴, and both World War One¹⁵ and World War Two¹⁶. Some were very successful politicians, notably a Governor of our Great State¹⁷ and a United States Congressman¹⁸. At least 47 were infants and young children, apparently reflecting the times when the power of our medicine was less than it is today. At least 101 lived beyond the biblical full measure of three score and ten. All were loved, and we honor and cherish the memory of each.

**BY-LAWS OF THE LIBERTY HILL PRESBYTERIAN CEMETERY ASSOCIATION
(AS AMENDED)**

1. The Trustees shall preserve and maintain the grounds, fences, gates and graves of the Cemetery, which adjoins The Liberty Hill Presbyterian Church and may acquire additional property for burial purposes when necessary.

(a) It shall be the duty of the Trustees to place a suitable stone marker at the four corners of all family squares where the boundaries are not now clearly defined, and to pay for same from Association funds. The Trustees shall allocate all space in the Cemetery; and any utilization, assignment or reassignment of space, or other use of the cemetery, must be approved by the Trustees.

2. A regular meeting of the Association shall be called by the Trustees once every four years, preferably on the second Sunday of June.

3. In the event of the death, resignation or inability to serve of any member of the Board of Trustees or any officer of the Association, the remaining members of the Board shall elect a successor from other members of the Association to fill the vacancy.

4. The Trustees shall elect from their number a President, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Association, each to hold office for a term of four years.

5. It shall be the duty of the President to preside over all meetings of the Association and to act as chairman of the Board of Trustees.

6. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a record of all meetings of the Association and meetings of the Board of Trustees, and to be custodian of same and all other records of the Association.

7. The Secretary shall have stationery printed showing the name of the Association, the names of the Trustees and the names of the President, Secretary and Treasurer, for use in correspondence connected with the business of the Association.

8. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to be custodian of all funds belonging to the Association, same to be placed in a separate account to the credit of the Association in a convenient and reputable bank or other institution carrying Federal insurance and to give an itemized report to the Association at least once each year showing all receipts, disbursements, and funds on hand.

(a) The Treasurer shall initiate and keep a checking account in a reputable bank in the sum of, not over \$300.00 to meet current cemetery expenses, but all other funds are to be deposited and preserved as now outlined in the Association's by-laws, or until further disposal by the Association.

(b) The Treasurer has authority to receive and acknowledge receipt of all funds. The Treasurer has authority to disburse funds which accumulate from interest and dividends. However, the capital funds of the Association, including certificates of deposit, may be disbursed only with the authority and consent of the Trustees, by the signature of two (2) officers, including the Treasurer.

9. Membership dues shall be \$1.00 per annum payable to the Treasurer on the 1st day of January.

10. The Treasurer may accept additional contributions from individual members or from family groups of the Association, and others.

11. In the event funds in the hands of the Treasurer become insufficient to meet expenses, the Trustees are authorized and empowered to assess each individual member to meet the deficit.

12. The Trustees shall in no way interfere with the wishes of the individual family and square owner in regard to monumental stones, shrubbery and flowers which the family may wish to maintain; but, in the event any square or grave is not properly cared for on account of absence of family members, or from other causes, it shall be the duty of the Trustees to employ all necessary labor to keep same in respectable state.

13. All adult members of the adjoining Liberty Hill Presbyterian Church shall be members of this Association. Any persons not members of the Liberty Hill Presbyterian Church may become members if they so desire, by contributing annually the amount equal to, or above, the annual dues.

14. There shall be a "Book of Remembrance" to record all past and future gifts and memorials; also, the names of the Trustees and their successors. One copy of the Book will be on display in the Church, another in the vault of the institution where the capital funds are deposited. The Treasurer is responsible for the maintenance and care of the "Book of Remembrance."

15. The "Liberty Hill Cemetery Memorial Endowment Fund" shall be established for the purpose of encouraging and recognizing substantial gifts and bequests to the Cemetery Association. All gifts of \$500.00 or more will be received and recognized through the Memorial Endowment Fund. These endowment funds shall be held by the Association as a sacred trust and no encroachment shall be made on the principal of these funds. Only the income derived from these funds may be used to promote the purposes of the Association.

(a) A "Liberty Hill Cemetery Memorial Fund" marker will be erected at the cemetery gate and the names of persons honored through this fund will be permanently inscribed and attached to this marker.

16. All funds of the Association are to be used solely for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Liberty Hill Cemetery at the discretion of the Board of Trustees. All funds may be invested or reinvested by the Trustees in accordance with their best judgment.

17. The Association shall also provide the means and accept funds to be used for the perpetual care and upkeep of the "Old Beaver Creek Cemetery" and the "Old Cunningham (Summerville) Cemetery."

Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery Grave Markers

The following notations are a record of the complete inscriptions found on the grave markers in the Liberty Hill Presbyterian Cemetery, Liberty Hill Community, Kershaw County, South Carolina. The information was first collected by Mary E. Cunningham during the winter of 1988-1989, then put on computer disk and printed by Frank K. Babbitt, Jr. The information is presented in sequence by "family square" number. A schematic diagram of the cemetery squares is at Appendix I. Family names are listed in the left margin for quick reference and an index of all the markers is at Appendix II. The slash mark indicates the end of a line on the stone or plaque. Notes considered appropriate are made as footnotes at the end of each square. The initials of the person making the note are shown in parentheses. The latest up-date was made in December of 1992 and is incorporated in this version of the survey.

There is speculation that the names would be Denton & Barber however there is no record.(MEC)

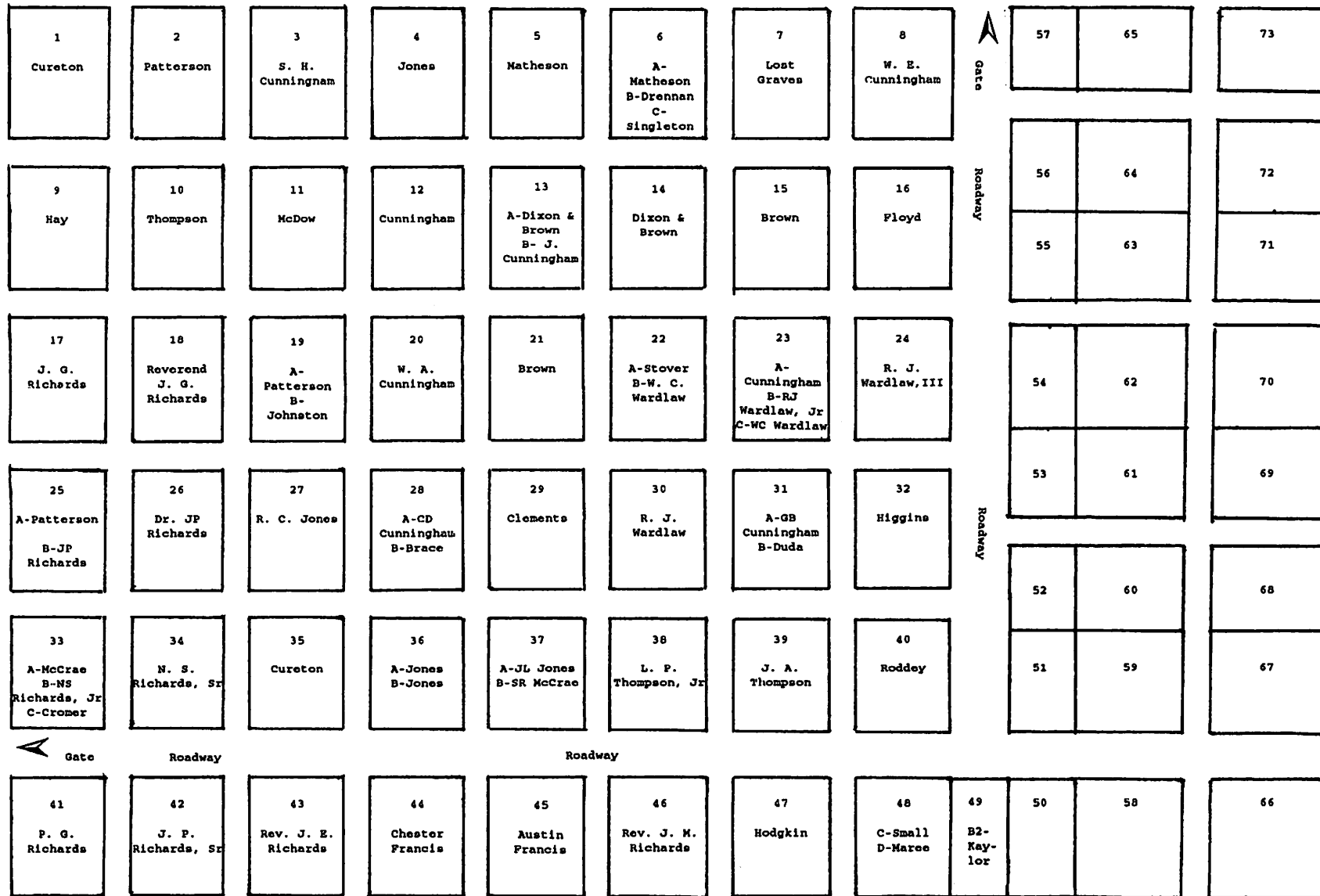
