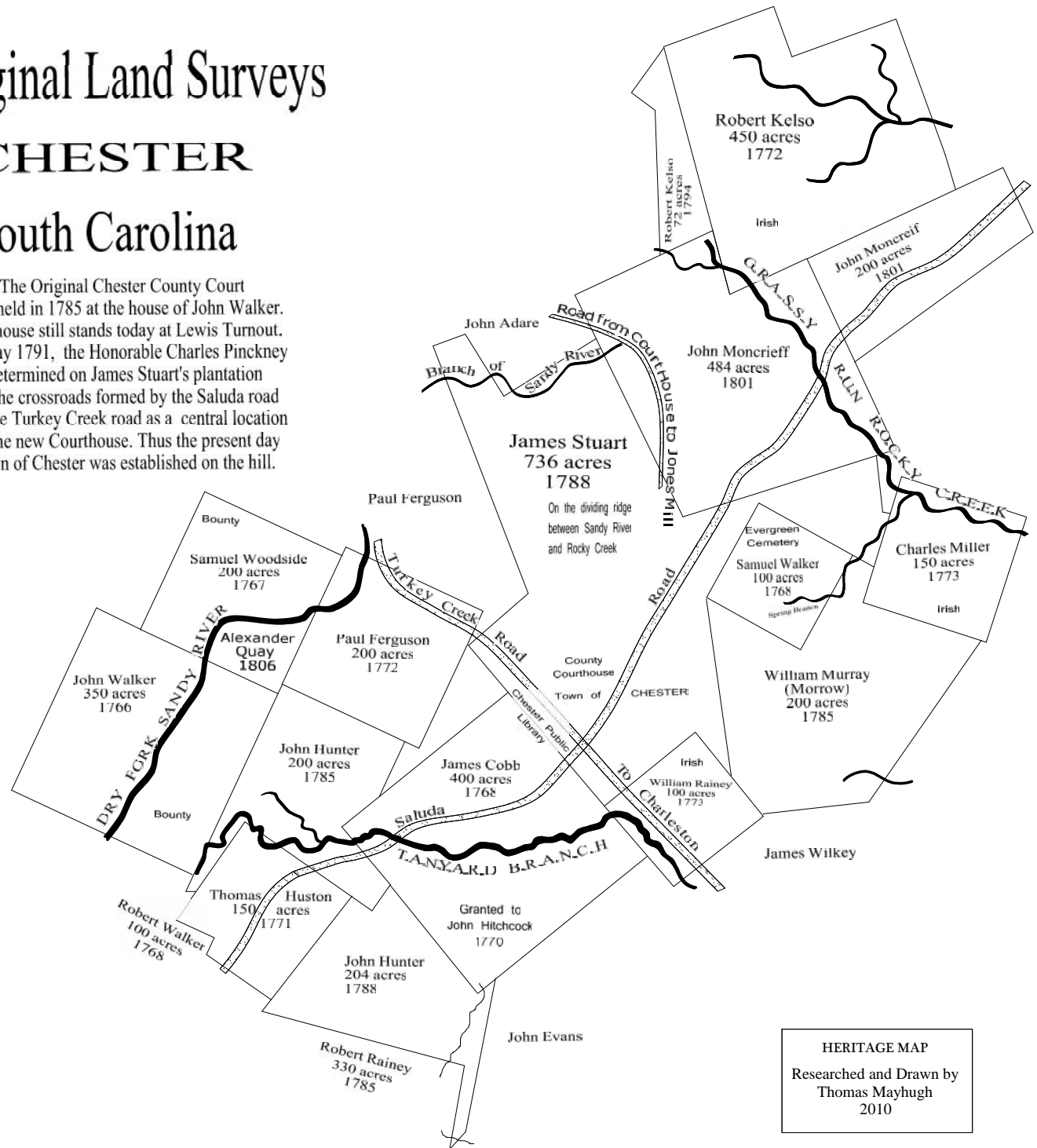

The Original Chester County Court was held in 1785 at the house of John Walker. His house still stands today at Lewis Turnout. In May 1791, the Honorable Charles Pinckney determined on James Stuart's plantation at the crossroads formed by the Saluda road and the Turkey Creek road as a central location for the new Courthouse. Thus the present day town of Chester was established on the hill.
