

WYLIE RECORD

Peter Wylie 1st. and wife, Annie Hawthorne came from Ireland, County Antrim. They lived at Big Spring, six miles north of Chester, S. C., (at present the home of Miss Belle Atkinson). Peter Wylie and Annie H. Wylie are buried at Fishing Creek Cemetery at Fishing Creek Presbyterian Church in Chester County. He had three sons and one daughter named Francis, James, William and Margaret. They were good Whigs during Revolutionary War.

William Wylie, son of Peter Wylie 1st., was a Revolutionary soldier who married Isabella Kolsey after the War. He had seven children and reared six. He moved to Alabama and died there at the age of 72 years.

Peter Wylie 2nd., son of William, lived at Lewis Turnout where he also died. He married Annie Evans.

They are buried in Chester Cemetery.
