

- 27: to protect a powder magazine. Fort Dorchester was used during the American mobile home. Revolution. The site became a state park in 1959 when the Forestry Commission leased twenty-one acres from Westvaco. In 1969, seventy-seven acres were acquired from Westvaco and one from the Episcopal Church. The park was later enlarged with the addition of 247 acres across the Ashley River from the town site.
