

January 12, 1887 Issue

Mr. James A. McCrorey died of pneumonia at his home at Blackstock on December 28th ult., age sixty-five years.

Mr. Henry Boylston, a former citizen of Winnsboro, died of consumption on Wednesday the 5th instant at Bechamville in Chester County. He was the son of the late **R. B. Boylston** and about twenty-five years old. His remains were interred in the Scion Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

February 2, 1887 Issue

Miss Eliza W. Barnwell, daughter of the late **Hon. Robert W. Barnwell**, died on Saturday in Columbia.

Mr. J. O. Nichols died near White Oak on Tuesday at the age of about forty. He leaves a wife and children.

February 9, 1887 Issue

Arthur Ben, colored about eight years of age, was accidentally shot and killed near Wallaceville.

Miss Mattie Neil died on Tuesday and was buried in the family graveyard near Wateree Church on Wednesday.

Mr. Manuel Thomas, colored, was found dead on Tuesday.

Major C. E. Thomas, of Ridgeway, died on Tuesday of heart disease at the age of forty-three. He leaves a wife and five children.

February 16, 1887 Issue

Mr. Rufus Oates, a former citizen of Blackstock, was killed at Birmingham, Alabama in a railroad accident. He leaves a widowed mother.

February 23, 1887 Issue

Mr. Francis W. Fickling died at his home in Columbia on Wednesday last at the age of seventy-seven.

March 9, 1887 Issue

Mr. James Cork Sr., originally from Fairfield County, died last Saturday in Donnalds, he is the father of **Prof. J. C. Cork**, of Prosperity.

March 16, 1887 Issue

Mr. Jas. Clark Propst died at the residence of his brother, **Mr. Jno. B. Propst**, near Feasterville on Tuesday of consumption at the age of forty. His funeral was held in the Presbyterian Church and he was buried in the churchyard.

April 6, 1887 Issue

Mr. J. B. Jones died from wounds he received from **Col. George Johnston** on Saturday last in Newberry.

Mr. Scott Copeland, colored man, died on Saturday.
