

Nickles Estate 1866

Dr John Nickles estate contained $2449\frac{7}{8}$ acres. After his wife's death, it was divided three ways - Each daughter received \$38,509.46 and land as follows:

Tract # 1 - Known as the Homestead Place, containing $842\frac{7}{8}$ acres - Dr Williams Wright

Tract # 2 - Known as the Paslay Place containing $826\frac{1}{2}$ acres - Rev. Galetta L. Halmer

Tract # 3. Known as the Garlington Place containing $780\frac{1}{2}$ acres. - Dr D. L. Anderson

Property appraisers were Capt James Davis, (who lived across Little River near his graveyard before Rupert Comptell's) Dr. F. G. Fuller (who lived where the Copelands ^{ed} remodeled) William Nelson Wharton, Esq (who lived before you come to the Dr Fuller ^{now ~~check~~} Copelands' home) and Henry Madden (who lived where the ^(Teigue) Smiths live now) Henry Madden ran the "Poor Farm" and some inmates are buried beside the (old) Smith House -)
