MUSTER ROLLS OF THE  
SOUTH CAROLINA GRANVILLE AND COLLETON COUNTY  
REGIMENTS OF MILITIA, 1756

Because militia laws stipulated that all men (except slaves) between the ages of sixteen and sixty were to be enlisted, the muster rolls of the militia provide a potentially rich source of information about the population of South Carolina prior to the census of 1790.<sup>1</sup> Unfortunately, however, these records are now woefully scarce. Hitherto, lists of men who served on the 1759 expedition against the Cherokee Indians have been the most important returns from the royal period generally known to scholars. But these documents include only volunteers and contingents from selected regiments.<sup>2</sup> Moreover, records that might conveniently supplement the militia rolls are either equally rare or of limited utility. For example, virtually all of the district tax returns from the royal period have now disappeared, while the extant colonial jury lists record only the names of taxpayers.<sup>3</sup>

The two muster rolls published here are therefore especially important. Fortunately they are also unusually fine examples of the

how Ruth Rawlins Lowndes spent the quarter-century of her widowhood that ended with her death in St. Kitts in 1763, save for a brief advertisement in the *South Carolina Gazette* of August 15, 1743, which adds a puzzling and somehow poignant footnote to the blank pages of her life story: "Ruth Lowndes. Reading, needlework."<sup>55</sup>

genre. Reports of militia strength generally appear to have been based on educated guesswork.<sup>4</sup> Not satisfied with this method and concerned about hostilities between Great Britain and France, Governor William Henry Lyttelton shortly after his arrival in South Carolina ordered each militia colonel to furnish complete information about the strength of his unit. By the spring of 1757 all regimental commanders had turned in reports—including the two muster rolls published here. A tabulation of these returns in the Council Journal indicates that the South Carolina militia then consisted of eight regiments containing about 6,500 officers and men. The approximately 1,000 names appearing on the muster rolls of the Granville and Colleton County units therefore constituted roughly 15 per cent of the provincial militia.<sup>5</sup>

Although most white men then living in the two counties probably appear on these lists, there are some known exceptions. Colonel Thomas Wigg of the Granville regiment reported that a number of "foreign Protestants from Germany" sufficient to form a company had settled on the headwaters of the Combahee River but that they had not yet been enrolled. Comparison of the Council Journal and the Colleton County return also indicates that the latter omits three companies on Edisto, Wadmalaw, and John's islands which totaled 183 officers and men.<sup>6</sup> Transients and others unknown to the commanding officers may also have been omitted, but even the aged, the infirm, and other individuals usually exempt from muster were listed. They constituted the "alarm men," a kind of reserve subject to call during a general alarm.<sup>7</sup> Inclusion of this category clearly indicates that these

returns were intended to serve as a census of all available manpower in each district.

The subsequent history of the reports which Governor Lyttelton received must be a matter of conjecture. Some colonels appear to have furnished full muster rolls of their regiments; other commanders seem to have merely tabulated the numerical size of each company under the names of its officers. Lyttelton probably forwarded all of these reports to John Campbell, the Fourth Earl of Loudoun, who was then commander-in-chief of the British forces in America. Four of these documents have not been located; the other four are now among the Loudoun Papers in the Henry E. Huntington Library and Art Gallery which has generously consented to publication of the two remaining muster rolls.<sup>8</sup>

Except for the following editorial changes, the documents printed here follow the manuscripts exactly. Superscript letters have been brought down to the line, and irregular punctuation marks, as well as spacing arrangements, have been silently modernized. Doubtful or indecipherable items have been indicated by the insertion of square brackets containing a question mark.

## PRESIDENT HAYES' "WITHDRAWAL" OF THE TROOPS— AN ENDURING MYTH

One of the most persistent legends of American history is that President Rutherford B. Hayes, as one of his first official acts, withdrew the last remaining United States troops from the South, thereby ending the surviving Reconstruction state governments. This statement has been repeated by textbook writers and others until it is a routine remark in any history of the South from the end of the Civil War until the close of the century. Ernest McPherson Lander, Jr., for example, in his recent work, *A History of South Carolina, 1865-1960*, says, "On April 10, he [Hayes] ordered the Union troops out of South Carolina."<sup>1</sup> Other recent historians, without exception, repeat the same thing in substance, and in 1966, in a syndicated Question and Answer column published in many newspapers, the question was asked: "In what year were the last federal troops moved out of the South after the Civil War?" The answer, of course, was: "In 1877, during the administration of President Rutherford B. Hayes."<sup>2</sup>

The supposed withdrawal of troops from the South creates in the mind of the uncritical reader a mental picture of masses of blue-uniformed soldiers marching northward from the occupied South. And with this mental picture, too, is a closely related image of great numbers of United troops holding the South in subjection by the weight of their numbers—a weight that was lifted by President Hayes.

No one can deny that the United States Army was used, during the Reconstruction period, for purely political purposes—to support and maintain the so-called "carpet-bag" governments, and that many disagreeable incidents occurred, as that in which Colonel de Trobriand, in
