Adm. Depts. store sill) at second level are two large arched openings with stone arch and brick infill. First floor storefront (within mall) has stone pillars with carved capitals, recessed central entrance flanked by display windows with low bulbheads and transoms. Side elevations with stepped parapets, no openings; flat roof is concealed by parapets; rear elevation has round arched windows with stone sills. First level of right elevation is obscured by adjacent building.
