Projecting bay at right with transom window; rear hipped projecting bay. Left elevation atop basement, with 3/1 windows with cast stone lintels and sills. Rear entry doors at second level of basement. Left elevation has series of 6-light windows at basement level. Historic rock.

25) HISTORY DATA: Area not included on 1900 Sanborn map; house appears on 1916 & 1920 maps. Home of William H. Fennell, a doctor who moved to Rock Hill in 1897. He opened a hospital on Charlotte St. in 1900; in 1909 he opened his Fennell Infirmary and nurses' training school at 304 North Confederate Ave.; it was acquired by the Catholic Church after his death (1915) and renamed St. Phillip's Mercy Hospital.


