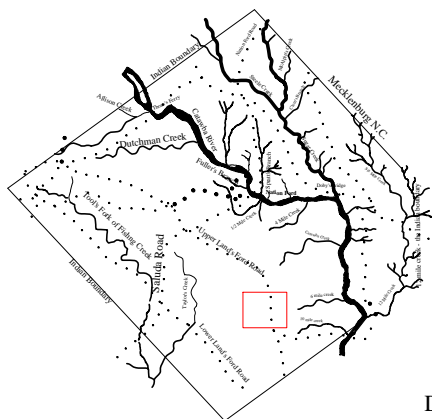

### Taylor's, Neely's and Six Mile Creeks

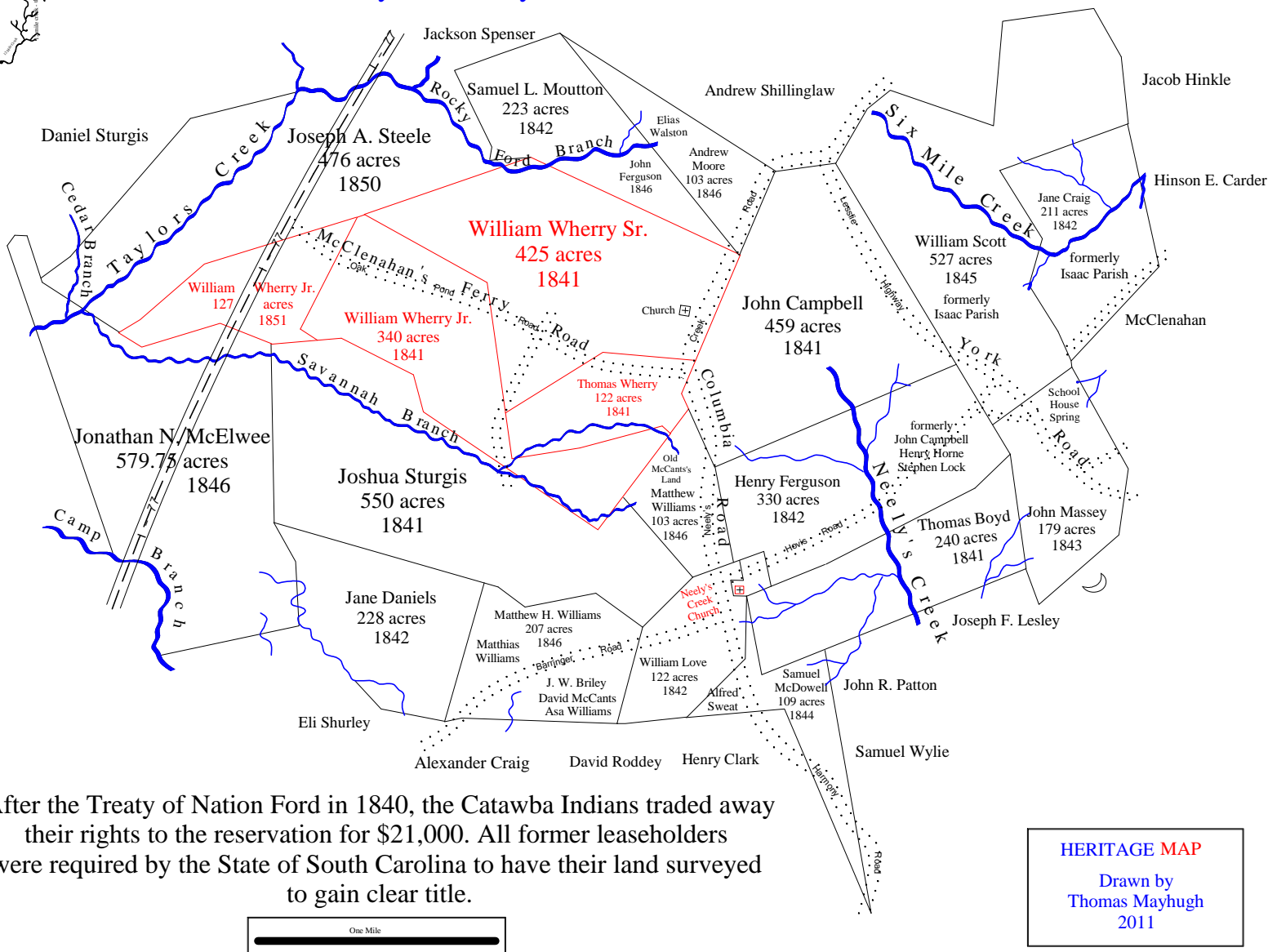


#### Catawba Indian Reservation

After the Treaty of Nation Ford in 1840, the Catawba Indians traded away their rights to the reservation for \$21,000. All former leaseholders were required by the State of South Carolina to have their land surveyed to gain clear title.
